- 2. Briefly explain how analogue codes differ from symbolic codes as described in Paivio's (1969) dual code theory.
- What do mental rotation tasks suggest in relation to theoretical perspectives on imagery

(b) LANGUAGE

- 4. Why was Chomsky's work considered important in the development of cognitive psychological accounts of sentence comprehension?
- 5. Briefly outline 3 types of inferences that are used in discourse comprehension.
- 6. What are the main stages of speech production, as outlined by cognitive psychologists?

(c) ATTENTION

- 7. Describe Kahneman's Central Capacity theory and discuss how it relates to divided attention.
- 8. Discuss the differences between automatic and controlled processing using Shiffrin and Schneider's theory.
- 9. Discuss the three factors that influence performance on divided attention tasks.

(d) COGNITION AND EMOTION

- 10. Discuss at least two strategies people use to regulate their emotions.
- 11. Explain what 'mood congruent memory' is and what it suggests.
- 12. Describe the 'emotional stroop task' and explain how it has been used to measure attentional biases.

- 4. Evaluate how speech errors have been used to support theoretical accounts of speech production. Incorporate relevant research to support your answer.
