- 1. There are many factors which contribute to a person offending. Using psychological evidence, discuss a range of these factors and consider the role of a forensic psychologist in working with offenders to address their offending behaviour.
- Forensic psychologists take a structured professional judgement approach to risk assessment. Using psychological evidence, describe the approach to risk assessment and discuss how this approach can be applied to working with offenders.
- Criminals are pre-disposed to commit crime because of their biological and genetic make-up. Discuss this statement with reference to psychological theory on crime and deviance.
- 4. Discuss how psychological theory can inform our understanding of Modern Slavery in terms of victim and perpetrator behaviour.
- 5. Why do people become terrorists? Discuss with reference to psychological theory and the UK government definition of Terrorism in the Terrorist Act 2000.
- 6. Why do people commit sexual offences? Discuss, referring to psychological theory.
- 7. Name the different categories of crimes of the powerful. Select two types and discuss how psychological theory attempts to explain them.
- 8. Discuss the nature of hate crime and explain how psychological theory helps us to understand this.
- 9. Using psychological theories, explain the concept of 'shame' in Honour-based violence.
- 10. Why don't people leave those who are abusing them? Identify and discuss psychological theories which would help to answer this question.
