Students will not be allowed to complete this programme without the necessary support of their employers / sponsors, including 	

confirmation that the entrant will have appropriate supervised practice in the clinical area in which they are expected to prescribe. Collaboration with Health Care Organisations in the selection of students will take place.

- Have an approved, designated Nurse Mentor who is also a qualified and active Nurse prescriber who will provide the student with supervision, support and opportunities to develop competence in prescribing practice. (This includes shadowing opportunities).
- Must have a current CRB check (within 3 years)

Aims of the programme

The principal aims of the programme are to enable you to:

1. Demonstrate safe, appropriate, and cost effective prescribing in practice from the Nurse Prescribers' Formulary for Community Practitioners for all age groups.
2. Critically appraise the professional, legal and ethical factors which influence safe prescribing practice.
3. Critically evaluate the clinical decision making strategies utilised in your assessment, diagnosis and treatment prescribed.
4. Demonstrate thorough pharmacological knowledge of the products you will prescribe.
5. Critically analyse the roles of other members of the multidisciplinary team in prescribing, supplying and administering medicines.

Distinctive features of the programme

The curriculum and web based e-learning resources for the programme have been developed collaboratively with Prescribing Programme Leads from other North West Universities to ensure high quality standardised learning content and curricula for all students undertaking this course within the North West of England.

The module can be combined with further modules to obtain a Post Graduate Certificate, Diploma, BSc (Hons) or Masters degree. The programme will focus on professional practice and therefore suits part time study.

All tutors within the programme are qualified healthcare professionals. To meet the professional body requirements – staff are required to hold a current professional qualification (Nurse / Pharmacist). It is also a mandatory requirement that tutors teaching on an NMC approved programme are on the same part or sub part of the register as the students and hold an NMC approved teaching and prescribing qualification.

Learning and teaching strategies				
A blended learning approach to teaching and learning is utilised, consisting of a mixture of classroom sessions; group work and directed study utilising e-learning materials and resources on Moodle.				
Reflective practice, group work, problem based learning, role play and critical analysis and discussion of major issues relating to prescribing practice are encouraged .				

E-learning materials and the curriculum for this programme have been developed collaboratively with other Non Medical Prescribing HEI Programme Leads and Tutors based within the North West of England. The materials are continually being developed and updated and ensure high quality, standardised learning resources that meets both the professional / regulatory body requirements and the major funding / commissioning body requirements (Currently the NHS North West Agency - Strategic Health Authority).

During the 6 days of practice based learning you are required to demonstrate competence to prescribe in the context of your own clinical area to meet the NMC (2006) Standards of Proficiency for Nurse and Midwifery Prescribers and this will be verified by a Nurse Prescriber Mentor in Clinical Practice .

In addition, group and individual tutorials are timetabled during the trimester to provide you with the opportunity to have at least two face to face tutorial sessions per trimester.

The range of teaching and learning strategies employed aims to maximise your learning potential. Support will be given whilst encouraging you to develop your own resources for independent learning.

Assessment strategy

Formative assessment strategy: You will submit elements of your portfolio providing evidence of your work towards the learning outcomes for formative assessment. Formative assessment is systematic and planned assessment that students are expected to undertake and to receive feedback via tutorials on, but is not considered at an assessment board and is not subject to internal or external moderation.

Summative assessment strategy: These are designed to test your achievement of the learning outcomes of the module. The summative assessment methods require you to demonstrate that you are able to prescribe medicines both safely and effectively for patients within the current legal, ethical and professional frameworks relating to prescribing practice. To achieve this aim you will undertake an invigilated pharmacology and numeracy exam and produce a practice portfolio that includes a reflective case study and reflective log of your learning relevant to prescribing practice within your own clinical

setting.

It is imperative that students are safe and effective prescribers. Any major failure to identify a serious problem or an answer that would cause a patient harm would result in overall failure. Any breach in patient confidentiality or use of unfair means may result in a referred result and referral to the 'Fitness for Practice' panel.
